Pancake Breakfast to Benefit St. Vincent de Paul

Plan to attend the All You Can Eat Pancake and Sausage Breakfast at Christ the King Parish on Sunday, December 6, from 8:00 A.M. to noon. The cost is \$4.50 for adults, \$2.50 for children ages 5-12, and free for children under the age of 5.

This event is sponsored by Catholic Knights Branch 88 and Christ the King Men's Club. The funds raised will go to the local St. Vincent de Paul Conference and the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry which serves needy families in the Madison area.



Catholic Knights will match funds up to \$500.

FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend is the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development and the Catholic Communications Campaign. Bishop O'Donnell united these two campaigns into one annual collection. Some dioceses have separate collections.

Bishop O'Donnell, like many bishops, felt that there were simply too many national collections each year. In the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Fla., where my parents lived six months each year, all national collections were combined into one collection. Commitments were made just as we are asked to make commitments to the Annual Catholic Appeal. Some formula was used to divide the collection among the various campaigns.

In the past part of the national collection to the Catholic Campaign for Human Development has been given to ACORN. In a letter to the priests of our diocese, Bishop Morlino asked us to tell you that no future funds will be going to that organization. Bishop Morlino pointed out that "ACORN and other entities which do not uphold, and sometimes act in opposition to, the teachings of the Catholic Church," will not receive any funds.

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development funds self-help projects for the poor. I believe 20- 25-percent of the collected funds stay within the diocese to help the poor of our area. If you are Dane County-centered, you may not know the deep needs of those in rural areas of our diocese. As a native of Grant County, I know that the folks are very proud and do not want to accept charity. Self-help projects are not perceived as charity even though donated funds might be used.

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development began as a five-year project that was to conclude in 1976, our bi-centennial year. One third of a century has passed and the collection remains. Once bureaucracies begin, they seem to become entrenched. I imagine that the bishops believe that the need is still great.

The Communications Campaign funds various ways of presenting the Catholic Church through the printed and broadcast media. You may see these spots on television or hear them on the radio. I have always admired Mother Angelica and her EWTN for accomplishing what the bishops couldn't – a national Catholic television network. She started with a hope and a prayer – especially a prayer – and produced a national television network.

I would like to remind you of our Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service this afternoon (Sunday) at 4:00 P.M. at the McFarland United Church of Christ.

Risky Business: Helping Teens Avoid Alcohol, Drugs, and Sexual Activity

The parents series will be held on Wednesday, December 2, from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. Scott Caldwell, a licensed clinical substance abuse counselor and prevention specialist, will answer the following questions:

- What is normal teen behavior (and is there such a thing)?
- What are good vs. bad risks?
- Can parents and other adults influence teens in their risk taking choices?

Mr. Caldwell will also discuss:

- The neurobiology of the teenage brain.
- Appropriate risk taking by teens.
- Strategies parents can use to guide their teens through these risk-taking years.
