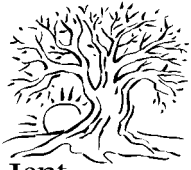

## Ash Wednesday is February 17



Lent

Lent 2010 begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday. The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent by attending to the following fast and abstinence regulations.

### Lent Fasting and Abstinence Rules for Catholics:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent, including Good Friday.
2. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday and are under 59 years of age are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday Fasts: only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

## Seat of Wisdom Coming to CTK

The Seat of Wisdom Institute is a program of Adult Faith Formation and Catechetical Certification for the Diocese of Madison. It is designed for all adults to deepen their knowledge of the Catholic faith.

The first course, *Introduction to Sacred Scripture*, is divided into three parts; two classroom presentations and a Bible study series. The two classroom presentations will be held at Christ the King Parish this spring, and the Bible study series will be done in small groups.

The first class, *Salvation History in Sacred Art* will be on March 2, from 6:00 to 8:30 P.M. The second class, *Scriptural and Theological Foundations*, will be held on April 26, from 6:30 to 8:30 P.M.

All catechists and those who may be interested in teaching in our religious education programs are encouraged to begin the Seat of Wisdom Institute. The diocese is asking that over the next few years, all catechists receive a religious education teaching certification, and the Seat of Wisdom Institute is a means to do that. ## THE PASTOR'S BLOG

Valentine's Day is for me not a very important day. I read that it is the most popular day for eating at restaurants. This year it might be spread throughout the days of the weekend. I imagine there are millions of greeting cards and countless tons of candy plus thousands of roses being purchased. I only hope that expressions of love are deeper than superficial expressions of Romanticized love.

Nobody refers to February 14<sup>th</sup> as "Saint Valentine's Day" any more. I imagine few people even know the origin of the term "Valentine's Day." In fact, the story of St. Valentine and his "love messages" in the shape of hearts delivered by birds is most likely just a legend. This day no longer has any religious connection although some parishes ask married couples to renew their marriage vows.

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. You will find the times of the Ash Wednesday services and the Lenten regulations in this bulletin. You will also find some of the Lenten programs that our parish offers including Communal Penance on March 22.

Last month the village board approved a change in the ordinance for signs in the village. Under the old ordinance, electronic message boards like ours were required to show the same message for a minimum of two minutes. The new ordinance lessens that to thirty seconds. While it means more time for me to program the sign, we are able to post more messages. And you do not have to wait in your car for the completion of a message.

I have limited what we post on the sign. First, messages should show events at our parish. I am amazed at the number of people – parishioners and non-parishioners – who read the sign. Marsh Road and Main Street have quite a bit of traffic especially immediately before and after school hours. The sign can remind folks of religious education programs, meetings, and other events at our parish.

Secondly, the message board can be a source of information about our parish to non-parishioners. I have posted feast days, liturgical seasons and other aspects of parish life. This helps community members know more about us and the Catholic faith. I hope this will improve our already good image in the community.

I have limited the messages to parish events or events directly related to the parish. Examples would be the Baccalaureate and the Thanksgiving Ecumenical Services neither of which was held at Christ the King this year. I don't want to make this a "community" bulletin board.

And best of all, your Scrip purchases have paid the entire cost of the construction of the sign. "The mortgage has been paid," if you will. As my father used to say to his patients who just received new dentures, "They will feel just like your own as soon as you pay for them."

### Trip to See the Dead Sea Scrolls

Come join us for a visit to the Milwaukee Public Museum on April 10<sup>th</sup> to see the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible exhibit. The Dead Sea Scrolls are ancient manuscripts of Old Testament writings found near the Dead Sea, giving us a glimpse at the scriptures Jesus would have read. The exhibit also includes some illuminated pages of the Bible from the middle ages and some pages of the contemporary St. John's Illuminated Bible. This is the largest temporary exhibit ever produced by the museum. It promises to interest scripture study groups and folks interested in archeology. It also has interactive portions designed to engage children. A replica of one of the caves and a stuffed camel make this a 3-dimensional experience, one your family won't want to miss.

Our bus will leave Saturday morning around 9:00 and return in time to attend the 5:00 Mass. The cost will be approximately \$45 (depending on the number of people who sign up to go). This cost includes the bus trip and the cost of admission to the museum and the exhibit.
