THE PASTOR'S BLOG

Congratulations to all of the fathers, grandfathers, great grandfathers, fathers-in-law, step-fathers and any other type of fathers whom I did not mention. And thanks to the dozen or so folks who will wish me "Happy Father's Day" today. In the United States we join 54 other countries around the world in celebration this day on the third Sunday of June. Other countries have chosen different dates.



To call it a "crisis" might be an overstatement. Yet the entire concept of fatherhood is under challenge in our society. Divorce is certainly a challenge. Perhaps the majority of divorced fathers are involved in the rearing of their children. But many are not.

A significant sector of women now chooses not to have fathers for their children. They may become pregnant and then not allow the father to become involved with, and maybe not even aware of, their child. And women can simply go to a sperm bank and through artificial insemination conceive a child. And in many places homosexual women can adopt a child.

As an advocate of traditional values – while well aware that things cannot always work out perfectly – I believe strongly that both a mother and father should be involved in the rearing of a child. A male and female parent adds an important dimension to the spiritual, social and psychological development of children. Many men and women do excellent jobs of fulfilling both roles and their children develop well. But this is not necessarily the case.

So today we pray for good fathers and that children may always have good fathers.

History generally credits Sonora Smart Dodd with the idea of Father's Day. After hearing a sermon on the newly recognized Mother's Day in 1909, she wanted to recognize fathers like her own, William Smart, who raised his family alone after his wife died in childbirth. The celebration began in Seattle on June 19, 1910.

Initially Father's Day was met with laughter. It became the source of satire and derision and jokes. Some saw it as the beginning of a calendar full of promotions. In 1913 President Wilson wanted to make it an official holiday, but this was resisted by Congress. It was not until 1972 that President Richard Nixon signed into law the permanent national holiday of Father's Day.

I hope you resist the commercialization of Father's Day and truly let the day be more than a façade. It should be a sincere expression of thanks to fathers.

Roman Missal

In 2010 the long-discussed Third Typical Edition of the sacramentary (which will then be called the Roman Missal) will be completed. This is the red prayer book that is used during Mass. Publication will follow after the final translation has been published.

We will be printing in this bulletin and in future bulletins the changes in the parts of the people. This may not be used until final approval. It is only the study edition.
