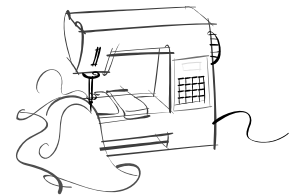

## THE PASTOR'S BLOG

I don't want to presume to speak for Bishop Morlino, but he has told us that he intends to issue a statement this summer concerning funerals in the Diocese of Madison. I am sure that he will discuss the nature of a Catholic funeral as a celebration of the Lord's paschal mystery and through baptism our sharing in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Certainly we want to remember the person who has died and share beloved memories of them. We want to salute their acts of service throughout their lives. Funeral homes like to advertise phrases such as "a celebration of life." And that is part of a funeral. But such phrases are marketing strategies.

The funeral Mass does not celebrate the life of a person. It celebrates the paschal mystery in which the deceased person shared. In an increasing secular society, the celebration of a life seems to have become the focus of funerals. This seems to impact upon how some view the Catholic funeral.

While bishops are certainly free to change their minds, I believe that Bishop Morlino will ask that eulogies be presented at the wake in the funeral home or at the luncheon following funerals. I believe that he will have the firm support of the priests of our diocese with his decision. We all have stories of the true abuse of eulogies – multiple folks speaking for an hour or more, people telling off-color jokes, people berating the Catholic Church, and more and more.

I have had funerals with brief (3-4 minute) eulogies and these have been fine. Unfortunately at many times this has gotten way out of hand. Some dioceses in the United States have already eliminated eulogies. At my aunt's funeral in Milwaukee, the parish limited the eulogy to reading the obituary in the newspaper. Nobody has the right to speak at a Catholic funeral and no one should presume that right.

This spring we set up the speaker system in the parish hall for eulogies during the funeral luncheons. This seemed to go well and I hope to continue this.

On an entirely different note, Bishop Morlino has also told us that the financial campaign for a new cathedral will be on the agenda in 2011. And to correct a frequent misconception, the funds to build the proposed new St. Paul's Center on the UW campus will come mainly from contributions by alumni throughout the nation and not from diocesan funds.

# Roman Missal

In 2010 the long-discussed Third Typical Edition of the sacramentary (which will then be called the Roman Missal) will be completed. This is the red prayer book that is used during Mass. Publication will follow after the final translation has been published. If you go on the Internet to [www.madisondiocese.org/Roman Missal](http://www.madisondiocese.org/Roman%20Missal), you may view the study edition in its entirety. This may not be used until final approval. It is only the study edition.
