### Catechist In-Service for Grades 2-5

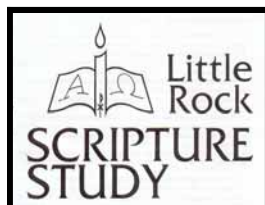

### KNOW OUR VOLUNTEERS Jim Klubertanz



Few parishioners have lived in the parish before it was a parish. Jim Klubertanz was reared on his family farm east of McFarland before our parish was founded in 1970. He still lives on the property of the family farm. Jim has

served three separate terms on our Pastoral Council and each term was with a different pastor. He has been actively involved in the parish Men's Club and has been a chef at pancake breakfasts for many years. Jim also serves as an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion and as a captain. And he is an usher.

### FROM THE PASTOR

I would like to welcome Fr. Stan back to Christ the King Parish. He has visited our parish for a number of years and now stands as our annual mission speaker. The diocese asks each parish to have a missionary speak annually. This lets parishioners see a broader spectrum of Church activity. Besides our local church, the diocesan church, national and international collections taken throughout our country; we need to support the worldwide missionary activities of the Church.

A century and a half ago, when our forbearers came to our country from around the world, missionaries came with them and many missionaries received financial support from Europe. Fr. Samuel Mazzachelli (called "Fr. Matthew Kelly" by the Irish lead miners of Southwest Wisconsin) came to our diocese from Italy and stands as a candidate for sainthood. But many others came. We in turn have the responsibility to support missionaries today.

Fr. Stan is a priest of the Diocese of New Ulm, Minnesota, but most of his priesthood was spent as a military chaplain. In his retirement, he became involved in the San Alfonso Mission in Juarez, Mexico. You have already heard his remarks at Mass. You know how his school has grown over the years and educated poor, young Mexicans. And since they are poor, they need money to pay for their education. The good, religious sisters dedicate their energy to operating the school. But certain supplies must be purchased to operate any school. Fr. Stan has made his case and I know that you will respond generously.

Besides supporting the school in Juarez, parishioners have journeyed for several years to build homes for the needy in Juarez. These cement block structures may not look too fancy by our standards, but if you are living in the city dump they must look like a palace to their new residents. The next build will be in early January. I know that the core group is looking for volunteers. College students on break have made excellent builders.

The good news is that we do not need to raise money for the 2010 build. Your donations have already raised the money. I am happy especially after asking everyone to contribute to the first Annual Catholic Appeal this spring that we don't have to ask again for a special collection.

Speaking of collections, for the last two years we have followed the protocol of the diocesan Offertory Giving Program. The diocese now gives us the option of opting out of this process. In previous years, we had a stewardship giving program in the fall. The diocesan program requires a sermon on giving and two weekends at which everyone at Mass is asked to make a financial commitment. We are returning to the letter writing campaign which I find less invasive to the weekend liturgies.

I presume that the Annual Catholic Appeal will follow the same protocol as last year. I doubt if we will be given the option of opting out of that protocol. They have moved the dates from April-May to February-March in 2010.

## Women's Silent Retreat
