## THE PASTOR'S BLOG

Often my blogs tend to be a bit reflective and theoretical. One parishioner told me – I hope humorously – that he learned new words by reading my blog. This week I would like to offer something more practical: What do you say to someone at a wake or a funeral?

When I meet with families to plan a funeral liturgy, I speak to them about people who want to say something comforting, and they say something that can be hurtful. They may not even realize that their words are not proper for the occasion. Perhaps they believe they are knowledgeable about what they are saying. But consider, and maybe even practice, what you will say.

If a parent has lost a child, please do not say to them, "You are still young and can have another child." This is logical. Couples theoretically can have children even in their 40s. But this is not comforting. Or please do not say, "Your child is now in heaven." I believe that children do not commit serious sin and their fate is heaven. But these are not comforting words to parents who have just had a child die.

Parents are overwhelmed by the great grief that their child has died. Their thoughts are not about future potential children. Their grief is about a child – a part of themselves – who has died. Thoughts about eternal happiness in heaven can in time be consoling. Yet at a wake or a funeral this is not their focus. In fact, such remarks can be a bit condescending. We don't need to show that we are smart. We need to show that we are truly sympathetic.

What is true about children can be true about older people, even seniors, who have died. "He/she is in a better place now" does not offer real comfort to a spouse or child who is burying a loved one.

So, what do you say? Please memorize this or a similar phrase to say to a mourner: "I am very sorry for your loss. I know how much you will miss her/him." If you wish, you may add if true: "I will remember you and your husband/father/brother/sister in my prayers."

That is not perhaps eloquent. Yet often times, what grieving people want to hear are not eloquent statements. They are just grateful that you cared enough about them and their deceased that you make the effort to express to them your sorrow at their loss. This is what they will remember and what will truly help them.

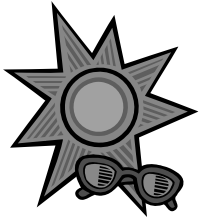

Publication will follow after the final translation has been published. This may not be used until final approval. It is only the study edition.
